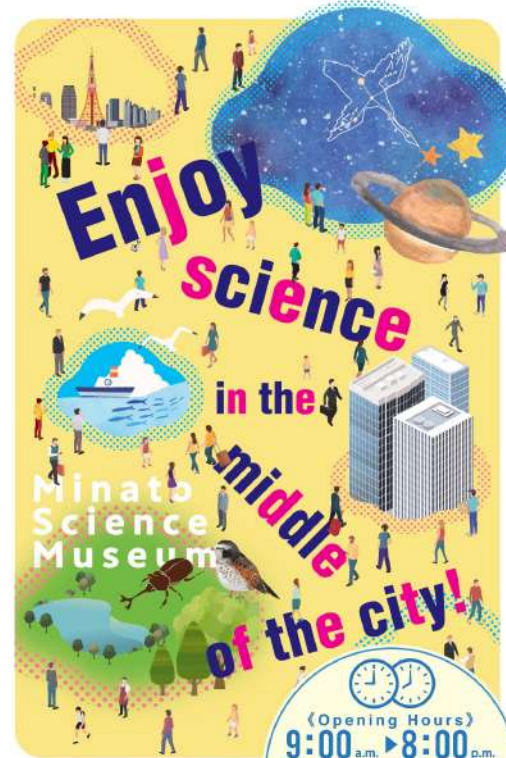

## Minato Science Museum

Regardless of whether you are a child or an adult, you can enjoy learning about science at the Minato Science Museum. The Permanent Exhibitions area on the 1st floor has four themes: Nature, City, Sea, and Humans. Through these themes you can learn about science all around you, and unravel its mysteries. In the Laboratory, you can enjoy experiments and crafts, and you can see exhibitions in the Multipurpose Lobby.

### Planetarium Hall

Look up to see a sky full of stars in Toranomon!

15-meter (49 feet) diameter dome  
121 seats



On the 2nd floor, there is Planetarium Hall which has a state-of-the-art optical projector called ORPHEUS, and a 4K digital planetarium, making it a "hybrid planetarium." We present over 8 million beautiful stars in the sky and projections filled with realism, along with explanations by the commentator about the seasonal constellations and the latest topics.

The Meteorological Science Museum acts as a gateway to disaster prevention, offering "weather forecasting experiences" that encourage the scientific curiosity of the mind, as well as a highly realistic 360° theater and other exhibits. At the museum, you can experience Japan's four seasons, nature, and weather, while learning about disaster prevention and mitigation.

### Tsunami Simulator



The exhibit simulates both normal waves and tsunamis artificially. The footage will help you understand how tsunamis work, and what the difference is between a normal wave and a tsunami.

### Sea

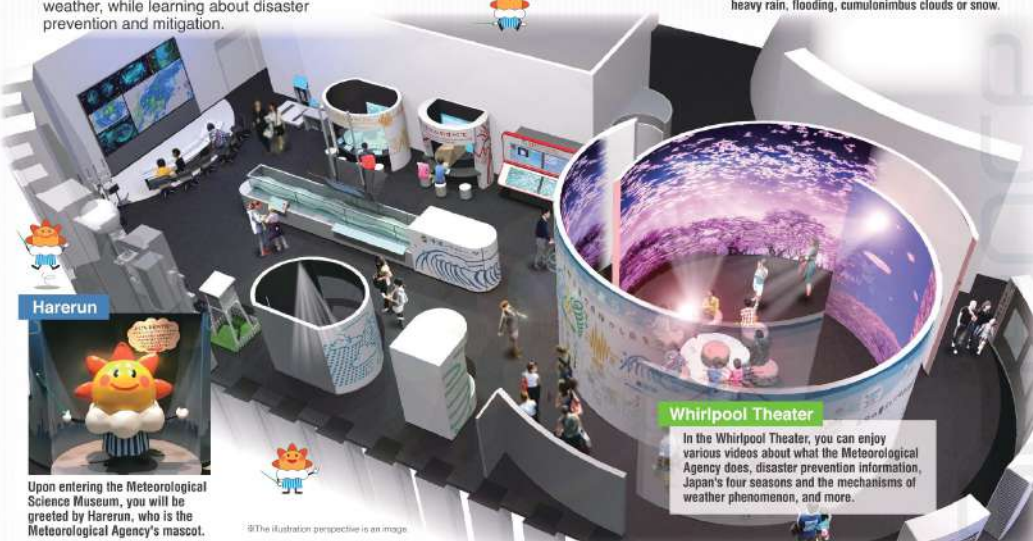
Why do boats float? Experience the flow of water in oceans and rivers.
